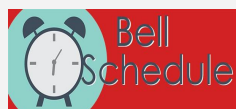

All medications must be in the original container, labeled with specific directions and accompanied by a doctor's prescription. Parents are always welcomed to come to the office and administer medication personally
- **26-27 Annual Update Completion in the Infinite Campus Parent Portal:** Just a reminder to complete the 26-27 annual update in your Infinite Campus Parent Portal. All students must have this completed in order to participate in field trips as well as other activities. Please ensure that this is completed as soon as possible. Pioneer After School Enrichment

What is PASE? PASE is a FREE after school program for *qualifying* families for students in grades TK-6.

How do I know if my child qualifies? Each year you must complete the online Interest Form *AND* the Free and Reduced Meal (FRM) Application which is part of the Annual Update in the Infinite Campus Parent Portal. If you qualify for FRM status, you qualify for PASE!

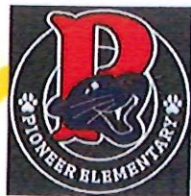
Pioneer School District is excited to introduce a new student grade and report card system this school year!

Here is what you need to know:

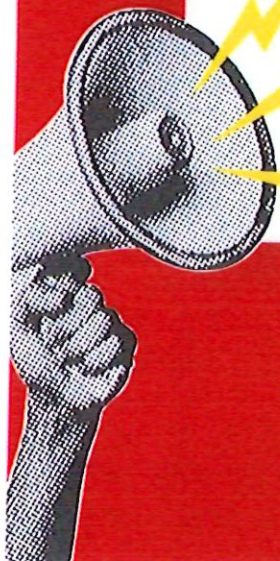

New Users

If you *don't* have a portal account:

1. Navigate to: <https://pioneerca.infinitecampus.org/campus/portal/parents/>
2. Click the green **Parent/Student** button.
3. Click **New User** at the bottom of the login screen.
4. Enter the unique **activation key** sent to you by your child's school. Please call your school office for this activation code.

Existing Users

Using the Web Portal

1. Navigate to <https://pioneerca.infinitecampus.org/campus/portal/parents/> .
2. Enter your username and password.
3. Click **Log In!**

Using the Mobile App

1. Download the app from the App Store or Google Play Store
2. Search for **Pioneer Union Elementary School District** and **California**. Select your district from the list
3. Enter your **Username** and **Password**, provided by your school
4. If using a secure, private device, mark **Stay Logged In** to receive mobile push notifications, if enabled by your school
5. Click **Log In!**

If you can't login to the portal:

- If you have forgotten your username or password, you may try the self-service tool linked from the Campus Parent (Web Portal or Mobile App) and click "Forgot your password/username" link.

IMPORTANT UPDATE:
NEW VOLUNTEER
REQUIREMENT



REQUIRED BY STATE LAW (SB 848)
Senate Bill 848 requires that all volunteers in school districts complete Mandated Reporter Training.



WHO THIS AFFECTS
This requirement applies to **ALL** volunteers, whether you are supervised by a staff member or working independently with students.



OUR COMMITMENT
This training helps ensure that anyone working with students knows how to recognize and report signs of abuse or neglect—keeping our students safe.

REQUIREMENTS AT A GLANCE

COACHES: ADDITIONAL TRAINING REQUIRED

Volunteers who coach a school athletic team must complete additional sports-related training in addition to the Mandated Reporter Training.



WHY THIS MATTERS

Mandated Reporter Training helps ensure that anyone working with students knows how to recognize and report signs of abuse or neglect. It keeps our students safe and ensures we all understand our responsibility to protect them.



NEXT STEPS

- 1 Complete your Volunteer Registration Form at the School Office.
- 2 Provide T.B. clearance and, if applicable, DOJ/FBI fingerprint paperwork.
- 3 Complete the District's online Mandated Reporter Training course before your service begins.
- 4 Sign in with the Site Secretary and wear your volunteer badge at all times on campus.

CLASS 1 E-BIKE

Pedal assist only

Motor assists only
when pedaling



- No age restriction
- Max assisted speed: **20 mph**
- Helmet required **under 18**
- Bike lanes OK.
- Trail access depends on local rules.



**Required lights and reflectors
when riding at night.**

Rear red light strongly recommended
at all times.

CLASS 2 E-BIKE

Pedal assist and throttle

Motor may be used
without pedaling



- No age restriction
- Max speed: **20 mph**
- Helmet required **under 18**
- Bike lanes OK.
- Trail access depends on local rules.



**Required lights and reflectors
when riding at night.**

Rear red light strongly recommended
at all times.

CLASS 3 E-BIKE

Pedal assist only

Motor assists only
when pedaling



- Riders must be **16+**
- Max assisted speed: **28 mph**
- Helmet required for **all**
- Bike lanes adjacent to roads OK.
- Multi-use trails only where permitted.



**Required lights and reflectors
when riding at night.**

Rear red light strongly recommended
at all times.

E-SCOOTER



- **16+** with driver's license
or valid ID
- No passengers
- Maximum operating speed: **15 mph**
- No riding on sidewalks
- Helmet required for riders **under 18**

MOPED / MOTORIZED BICYCLE



- M1 or M2 driver's license required
- Must be registered with DMV
- License plate required
- DOT helmet required
- Not allowed on bike trails

E-MOTORCYCLE



- Street-legal models must be
registered and plated
- DOT helmet required for all riders
- Off-highway motorcycles may only
operate off-road unless fully
street legal (registration,
equipment, and licensing
requirements met)
